

APIDA Center learns about APIDA Voters in San Diego!

Early federal policies such as the Naturalization Act of 1790 and the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 barred the APIDA community from becoming U.S. citizens and therefore, denied them the right to vote until 1952. The passage of the Immigration Acts of 1952 and 1965 lifted the policies that limited APIDA people's right to citizenship. In addition, the Voting Rights Act of 1965 further prohibited racial discrimination in voting, opening the opportunities for APIDA voters to exercise their right.

According to a <u>2024 report</u> by Asian & Pacific Islander American (APIA) Vote, San Diego County has about 270,188 APIDA eligible voters, which is almost 18% of the county's total voter population. Although the number of APIDA voters in San Diego has grown, voter engagement remains low due to several reasons, with language barriers being one of the primary challenges.

With increasing APIDA representation in political leadership, the APIDA community continues to be an electoral force. In San Diego, there are several organizations dedicated to supporting the APIDA vote, such as San Diego Asian Americans for Equality (SDAAFE) and Asian Pacific American Coalition (APAC). These organizations aim to increase voter education and participation.








APIDA Center hosts Club Karaoke!
