APIDA Center learns about Diwali in San Diego!

<u>Diwali</u>, the Festival of Lights, is a five-day celebration of the triumph of light over darkness, good over evil, and wisdom over ignorance. Diwali is celebrated every year by billions of Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, and Buddhists around the world.

One of the largest Diwali celebrations in San Diego takes place at Balboa Park. The annual event was established by the <u>San Diego Indian</u> <u>American Society</u>, which was founded in 1984. Since 2012, the Festival of Lights in Balboa Park has been a highly-anticipated, city-wide celebration held annually in October. It is one of the unique cultural events in San Diego that attracts over 10,000 people each year. Balboa Park's Diwali celebration involves the exhibition of large lamps featuring ancient designs that represent various regions and faiths of India as well as a procession of over 1,000 lights. This year, the 12th annual Diwali festival was held on October 19th.

The APIDA Center has been celebrating Diwali since 2020. This year, Diwali is celebrated from October 29th to November 3rd. Join the APIDA Center for a series of event to celebrate Diwali, including Poker Night at the APIDA Center, D.I.Y. Chai, and Rangoli Coasters Workshop.
