#### **APIDA Center meets Cynthia Bonta!**

On Sunday, October 27th, the APIDA Center proudly sponsored a table at the inaugural Larry Itliong Community Breakfast. One of the major highlights was listening to and meeting Mrs. Cynthia Arnaldo Bonta (the mother of Rob Bonta, the first Filipino American to be Attorney General of California).

Cynthia Arnaldo Bonta was born on October 9, 1937 in the Philippines. She graduated from the University of the Philippines Diliman with a BS in Zoology in 1958. She also earned a Master's Degree in Religious Education at the Pacific School of Religion in 1968.

Bonta is a longtime activist who organized alongside labor leaders Larry Itliong and Philip Vera Cruz, helping organize Filipino and Mexican farmworkers for the United Farm Workers. She was a member of the Union of Democratic Filipinos (KDP) and Anti-Martial Law Coalition (AMLC). In addition, she is a mother of three children: Lisa Ligaya (born 1969), Robert Andres Bonta (born 1971), and Jonathan Marcelo Bonta (born 1973). She proudly commented how her children were born and raised in activism.

Bonta was active in the Civil Rights, anti-Vietnam War, and farmworker movements. She volunteered at the Filipino Hiring Hall at Delano during the Grape Strike of 1965. Six years later, Bonta volunteered full time to work on the LA Boycott and later at the United Farm Workers Headquarters at La Paz to set up the UFW health clinics up and down the imperial Valley. In 1977, she protested the eviction of elderly Manongs at the I-Hotel.

In her keynote, she said two things that resonated with us: "History shapes us" and "Community is our conscience."

**Neil Catungal** was one of the students who met Mrs. Bonta. He said, "The speech by Cynthia Bonta is something that really changed my direction into how I want to contribute to my community. Initially, I thought being a high school teacher was my ultimate goal. However, I now know I can do much more. After hearing Cynthia Bonta's speech about the way people should know their identity, find their community, and look toward how they want to be a part of that community is something that really spoke to me. I can be a more community-centered teacher and use teaching as a platform for change."
