
San Diego has a lot of APIDA military history!

Did you know that in 1941, the U.S. Armed Forces recruited Filipinos to serve on behalf of the United States during World War II (1939-1945)? Over 250,000 Filipinos served in the U.S. military. For many, military services was a pathway to citizenship. For example, immigration policies like the War Brides Act of 1945 allowed the spouses and children of U.S. military servicemen to enter the United States as non-quota immigrants. As such, large waves of Filipino immigrants arrived in San Diego after World War II.

Did you know that the Filipino American Veteran Association (FAVA) was formed in 1946? Members of the organization raised funds to build FAVA Hall which opened on October 16, 1949. It is located on 2962 Market Street in downtown San Diego. FAVA was the first Filipino organization to build a community center in San Diego. FAVA Hall continues to serve as a major hub for the growing Filipino American community.

Did you know Kurt Chew-Een Lee (1926-2014) was the first Asian American officer in the Marine Corps? Lee was born in San Francisco. His two brothers became distinguished Army officers who served in the Korean War (1950-1953). Inspired by his brothers, Lee joined the U.S. Marine Corps in 1944. He started his military career at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego, where he learned the Japanese language. After graduating, he was hired as a Japanese language instructor before serving in the Korean War (1950-1953) and Vietnam War (1955-1975).
