

APIDA Center learns about Southwestern Community College's APIDA learning communities!

On Tuesday, November 12, 2024, students, faculty, and staff from Southwestern Community College (SWC) visited the APIDA Center. Students from the Bayan and Sangam Learning Communities learned from a panel of current transfer students, who shared the joys and challenges they faced in their transition to San Diego State University.

Southwestern Community College (SWC) is located south of San Diego close to the U.S.-Mexico border. It began offering classes to 1,657 students in 1961, with temporary quarters at Chula Vista High School. Eventually, it expanded its off-campus locations by establishing the Higher Education Center in San Ysidro, National City, and Otay Mesa.

Learning communities at SWC were established in 2006 with the formation of Bayan, which became the first Filipino American student-focused learning community in Southern California. Bayan was founded by Professors Maria Abuan, M.S., and Henry Aronson, M.S., both of whom wanted to amplify and acknowledge the issues and experiences faced by Filipino American students in higher education. (Learning communities at SWC involve linked classes taught by faculty members who make the course content more relevant to students' identities and experiences; they also build collaboration and community among peers.)

SWC's newest learning community is the Sangam Asian Pacific Islander (API) Learning Community. Sangam was established in 2024, with Dr. Samone Sayasenh and Assistant Professor Joseph Allen "JoJo" Ruanto-Ramirez serving as the community's inaugural coordinators. The Sangam Learning Community links professional development courses with Asian American studies courses. The Sangam Learning Community also offers support through field trips, workshops, and community-building programs.
