

#### **APIDA Center learns about Loy Krathong in San Diego!**

Loy Krathong is one of the largest festivals in Thailand. It is celebrated on the full moon night of the twelfth month in the Thai lunar calendar. (This year, it falls on November 15, 2024.) It is typically celebrated by creating and floating krathongs (small, religious offerings). People also decorate homes with lanterns to welcome a bright future. They also watch parades, dance performances, and fireworks.

Thai immigrants have brought Loy Krathong to the United States. Major waves of Thai immigrants arrived here as a result of the Vietnam War (1955-1975). During the 1980s, about 6,500 Thai immigrants came each year. By 1990, approximately 91,000 people of Thai ancestry were living in the United States, with California having the highest concentration. In fact, San Diego County has almost 5,000 Thai American residents - making it one of the top ten counties with high populations of Thai Americans.

Several Thai American community organizations in San Diego host small-scale celebrations for Loy Krathong. One of the major events is the annual Loy Krathong Festival hosted at *Wat Buddhajak* (Thai Buddhist Temple) in Escondido. The festival includes traditional dancing, religious rituals, and traditional crafting activities.

On Monday, November 18th, the SDSU APIDA Center celebrated Loy Krathong in collaboration with South East Asian American Alliance (SEA^3). Participants learned about the historical and cultural significance of Loy Krathong. Afterwards, students made an origami lotus krathong and enjoyed a typical Thai dessert of tapioca pudding with mangoes and coconut milk.
