#### APIDA Center learns about karaoke in San Diego!

On Thursday, December 5th, the APIDA Center hosted another <u>Club</u> <u>Karaoke</u>! There was singing, dancing, and lots of silly antics. Our students are so much fun.

Karaoke was invented by Japanese businessman Daisuke Inoue (born 1940). He created the the first karaoke machine, known as the "8-Juke," in 1971 in Kobe, Japan. Karaoke's massive success in Japan eventually led to its global spread. Karaoke made its way to the United States in the early 1980s. In 1982, businessman Sal Ferraro (1931-2022) opened "Dimples" in Burbank, California - the first karaoke bar in the United States. (Dimples closed in 2015; it was pushed out to make room for condos and a Whole Foods.)

In San Diego, the popularity of karaoke was on the rise in the 1990s. One of the oldest American karaoke bars in San Diego is The Lamplighter, located in Mission Hills. The dive bar opened in 1957 and established its nightly karaoke events in the early 1990s. Similar to many American karaoke bars, customers at The Lamplighter typically sign up for a waitlist, share one karaoke machine, and sing in front of large crowds. (American karaoke involves performing in public spaces with large crowds.)

In 1996, Jin Music Studio was established by a South Korean immigrant couple in what is now the Convoy Asian Cultural District. It became the first Asian karaoke business in San Diego. (Asian karaoke involves singing in front of a small group or in a private room.)

Today, there are many karaoke businesses in San Diego. In February 2024, The Gaslamplighter, in San Diego's Gaslamp Quarter, became the county's newest karaoke bar. And of course, there's the APIDA Center's Club Karaoke!
