



APIDA Center celebrates Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day!

In the 1960s, the United States was immersed in the Civil Rights Movement, a struggle for justice and equal rights led by Black Americans. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (1929-1968), who was born on January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia, is widely recognized as one of the leaders of the movement.

Did you know Dr. King visited SDSU? In May 1964, Dr. King spoke in our Open Air Theatre to over 4,000 people. Less than two months later, the Civil Rights Act of 1964 was signed. It outlawed discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

Dr. King has often credited Mahatma Gandhi (1869-1948) as a major source of inspiration. Gandhi led a movement to liberate India from British colonial rule and espoused the idea of nonviolence. King embraced Gandhi's nonviolent philosophy. Gandhi, however, was not the only South Asian influence on the Civil Rights Movement. Manmatha Nath Chatterjee (1888-1964) and Krishnalal Shridharani (1911-1960), two South Asian American activists, also played important roles in this fight for liberation.

Other Asian American activists also stood in solidarity and joined the fight for civil rights along with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. For example, Kiyoshi Kuromiya (1943-2000), a Japanese American civil rights and gay rights activist, served as an aide to Dr. King. Kuromiya supported the marches from Selma to Montgomery in Alabama. He helped Black high school students register to vote. During the week of Dr. King's funeral, Kuromiya cared for his children.

Days after Dr. King's assassination, community leaders started a campaign for a holiday in his honor. On November 2, 1983, President Ronald Reagan (1911-2004) signed the King Holiday Bill into law, designating the third Monday of January a federal holiday in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The campus will be closed on Monday, January 20th to celebrate the life and legacy of Dr. King.

The San Diego community continues to honor Dr. King. The <u>Gus and Emma Thompson Black Resource Center</u> will be participating in the 43rd annual Martin Luther King Jr. Day Parade this Sunday, January 19th starting at 11:00am on Harbor Drive in downtown San Diego. Join us!
