# From Dr. Loh-Hagan: Attend our programs!



# APIDA Center learns about Lunar New Year Celebrations in San Diego!

Lunar New Year is a holiday that celebrates the arrival of Spring. It is typically celebrated in late January or early February and lasts for 15 days. Lunar New Year is an important celebration in several Asian countries including China, Korea, Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia, and Vietnam. This year, Lunar New Year is celebrated on January 29th, 2025.

There are several Lunar New Year celebrations across San Diego. One of the earliest celebrations is the <u>San Diego Chinese New Year Fair</u>, which was started in 1983 by the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association. Many of the founding members are descendants of Chinese immigrants who settled in San Diego in the 1880s. This year, the organization is hosting their 42nd annual Chinese New Year Fair at Balboa Park from February 15th to 16th from 11-5pm.

Another big celebration that attracts thousands of attendees each year is the <u>San Diego Tết Festival</u>. The San Diego Tết Festival was started by the Vietnamese American Youth Alliance (VAYA) over 20 years ago. Today, it is considered the second largest Tết festival in the United States. This year, the San Diego Tết Festival will take place from January 31st to February 2nd at NTC Park in Liberty Station.

The APIDA Center has been celebrating Lunar New Year since 2021. This year, join us on Wednesday, January 29th from 4-6pm to celebrate the Year of the Snake. We will be featuring lion dancing from the White Dragon of East County from 4-5pm in the Student Union Courtyard. Then join us at the APIDA Center from 5-6pm for fun activities, tea, and snacks!
