APIDA Center learns about the UVSA Tết Festival!

Tết, also known as Tết Nguyên Đán, is the Vietnamese Lunar New Year. Tết Nguyên Đán translates to "Feast of the First Morning." Tết celebrates the arrival of spring and lasts for up to seven days. During this time, families reunite, honor ancestors, and wish for good fortune in the upcoming year.

The largest Tết celebration in the United States is the <u>UVSA Tết Festival</u> that takes place annually in Southern California. The festival is organized by the <u>Union of Vietnamese Student Association (UVSA)</u>, which was established in 1982. UVSA brings together Vietnamese American youth including students from different colleges and high schools throughout Southern California. Its goal is to build unity and advocate for social justice issues that affect the larger Vietnamese and Vietnamese American community.

For over 40 years, the UVSA Tết Festival has brought over 50,000 guests from across the United States. The celebrations include a vibrant showcase of Vietnamese culture, food, and entertainment. This year, the UVSA Tết Festival theme is "A Spring of Remembrance," or "Xuân Hoài Niệm." To celebrate the Year of the Snake, the UVSA Tết Festival will take place from Friday, January 31st to Sunday, February 2nd at Garden Grove Park.

SDSU's Vietnamese Student Association (VSA) was established in 1968 and is a member of UVSA. They hosted an activity table at our Lunar New Year festival and are preparing for their Vietnamese Culture Night in April. Our student orgs are amazing!

The Fred Korematsu Day of Civil Liberties and the Constitution is celebrated on January 30. It was first signed into law in California in 2010 and is now celebrated in at least seven other states. It commemorates the birthday of Fred Korematsu (1919-2005), a Japanese American activist who resisted the incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II (1939-1945). It is the first day in U.S. history named after an Asian American.

On Thursday, January 30th, the APIDA Center teamed up with the Japanese Student Association (JSA) to host a cultural education program about Fred Korematsu.
