

APIDA Center learns about the Day of Remembrance!

On February 19, 1942, President Franklin D. Roosevelt (1882-1945) signed Executive Order 9066, which authorized the U.S. Army to forcefully remove and incarcerate over 120,000 Americans of Japanese ancestry. In 2022, President Joe Biden (born 1942) declared February 19th as the National Day of Remembrance of Japanese American Incarceration During World War II (1939-1945).

Decades before Biden's proclamation, individual states have been celebrating their own Day of Remembrance. The <u>first Day of Remembrance</u> event was observed on November 25, 1978 in Seattle, Washington. It was a part of the movement to fight for redress and reparations for Japanese Americans who were unjustly incarcerated after Japan's attack of Pearl Harbor in 1941. It was organized by the Evacuation Redress Committee of the Seattle Chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League. The event took place at the Puyallup Fairgrounds, which was formerly the Camp Harmony Assembly Center. During the event, formerly incarcerated Japanese Americans commemorated their experiences and histories by sharing their stories with the youth.

The State of California designated February 19th as their Day of Remembrance in 1986. Two years later, the Civil Liberties Act of 1988 was passed, granting over 80,000 surviving incarcerees \$20,000 in reparations. Since then, cities across California host events to commemorate and preserve the history of the Japanese American incarceration experience.

Their shops were on every street in my city, so I would never miss a chance to go there when I saw one, especially on a hot, summer day. When I came to San Diego for college and saw that they had it here too, I couldn't wait to visit it and get a cup of their boba milk tea! Although it isn't two bucks a cup like it is back home, this boba tea is as close to authentic, Taiwanese-style boba as any other place here in San Diego. 10/10...I would highly recommend it to y'all!"
