

# APIDA Center celebrates Guam History and CHamoru Heritage Day!

CHamoru refers to the indigenous people of the Mariana Islands including Guam. (CHamoru is the preferred term used by the Indigenous people of Guam; Chamorro is the more conventional spelling.)

Guam History and Chamorro Heritage Day was previously a commemoration of the anniversary of the island's "discovery" by the Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan (1480-1521). Over the years, the spirit and purpose of the day have evolved. The enormous loss of culture and heritage due to a long history of colonization in Guam continues to impact its politics and society. As a result of cultural advocacy by the global Chamoru community, Guam History and Chamoru Heritage Day is now a national public holiday on the island that celebrates indigenous heritage/culture and the right to self-determination.


On March 3rd, 2025, San Diego's CHamoru community leaders and organizers spoke at City Hall to uplift the rich history, culture, and contributions of the CHamoru people in San Diego and beyond. In a unanimous vote by the council, March 3rd was announced as "Guam History and CHamoru Heritage Day" in the City of San Diego!

This year, Che'Lu San Diego is hosting their 13th annual <u>CHamoru</u> <u>Cultural Festival</u> on Saturday, March 22nd from 10-6pm at the Oceanside Pier Ampitheater. The SDSU APIDA Center is planning to take students on the field trip to visit the festival! RSVP by Friday, March 14th and join us!

In addition, the APIDA Center is hosting several Mes CHamoru events including <u>SPAM in Guam</u>, <u>Jazz in Guam</u>, <u>CHamoru Feast</u>, <u>Climate Change</u> <u>& Guam</u>, and a featured speaker Mr. <u>Melvin Won Pat-Borja</u>. Mr. Pat-Borja is the Executive Director of the Commission on Decolonization and the President of the Department of CHamoru Affairs.
