APIDA Center learns about the Vietnamese language in San Diego!

Tiếng Việt refers to the Vietnamese language. It's believed to have formed around 4000 to 5000 years ago, with great influences from the Chinese. French colonization of Vietnam (1888-1954) also greatly influenced the language via French loanwords, pronunciations, and grammar.

The Vietnamese language is also influenced by the English language. The Vietnamese alphabet has essentially the same letters as the English alphabet, with both following the Latin alphabet. The Vietnamese language also contains English loanwords.

Approximately 86 million people worldwide speak Vietnamese, with the majority residing in Vietnam, making it the 21st most spoken language globally. Over 1.5 million people in the United States speak Vietnamese, making it one of the most commonly spoken languages in the country. Vietnamese is the fifth most commonly spoken language in San Diego, with nearly 1% of the population speaking it (or 23,000 speakers).

After the Fall of Saigon (1975), the first wave of Vietnamese refugees arrived in the United States through Camp Pendleton, the major West Coast base of the U.S. Marines located in Oceanside. As a result, many Vietnamese refugees resettled and stayed in San Diego to build their community. Today, there are over 50,000 Vietnamese Americans living in San Diego County.

The <u>Bilingual Development in Context (BDC) Lab at SDSU</u> is an educational research center that investigates language development among bilingual children, particularly children who speak a minority first language such as Vietnamese and who learn English early in childhood. Its director, Dr. **Giang T. Pham**, also serves as a leading researcher for a grant-funded project entitled, "VietSLP Speech-Language Pathology Resources for Supporting Vietnamese Children." The project is a collaborative effort by both Vietnamese and Vietnamese American scholars and researchers to address the communicative needs of Vietnamese populations worldwide via online resources.

Fun Fact: The SDSU APIDA Center and SDSU <u>Vietnamese Student</u>
<u>Association</u> (VSA) hosted a Vietnamese Language Workshop on March
25th. Participants discussed the historical and cultural significance of the
Vietnamese language and then learned basic Vietnamese words and
phrases.








APIDA Center learns about Pacita Abad and Sashiko!
