## APIDA Center learns about San Diego's Khmer New Year Festival!

Cambodians in San Diego first arrived in the 1970s as refugees escaping the Khmer Rouge regime (1975-1979). About 2,000 Cambodian refugees were processed at Camp Pendleton. Many of them resettled in San Diego and surrounding areas, establishing their communities by building businesses and cultural institutions for future generations. Today, there are significant concentrations of Cambodian Americans in City Heights and other parts of eastern San Diego.

One of the most significant gatherings of Cambodian Americans in San Diego takes place during Khmer New Year, also known as Choul Chnam Thmey. Khmer New Year is a three-day celebration that takes place from April 13 through April 15. It indicates the end of the harvesting season and symbolizes the renewal of nature and people.

San Diego's Khmer New Year Festival is organized annually by the Khmer American Mutual Association (KAMA) of San Diego, whose mission is to connect older and younger generations of Cambodian Americans with hopes of sharing and preserving Khmer culture. KAMA has been organizing the festival since 2019. Each year, the festival brings together the local Cambodian American community to partake in religious ceremonies, support Cambodian American artists and businesses, and enjoy cultural food and performances. This year, KAMA's Khmer New Year Festival will take place on Saturday, April 26 and Sunday, April 27 at Colina del Sol Park in City Heights.

The SDSU APIDA Center will also be celebrating <a href="Thai, Lao, and cambodian New Year">Thai, Lao, and Cambodian New Year</a> on Monday, April 14th.\* Join us to learn about the historical and cultural significance of <a href="Green Papaya Salad">Green Papaya Salad</a> from 1-2pm. Come learn about <a href="Cambodian Rock Music">Cambodian Rock Music</a> from 4-5pm. Then, make <a href="Lao Tai Lue dreamcatchers">Lao Tai Lue dreamcatchers</a> from 6-8pm.

### **APIDA Center learns about Asian skincare culture!**


