From Dr. Loh-Hagan: SDSU at MLA!

This academic year, we were proud to represent SDSU at the CSU Middle Leadership Academy, a professional development program grounded in a problem-based learning model that motivates participants to "lead from the middle" in order to explore and apply strategies to support equitable student success. APIDA Center learns about William Heath Davis!

William Heath Davis (1822-1909), also known as "Kanaka Bill," was born in Honolulu, Hawaii in 1822. He came from a family of shipowners from Boston who was involved in the trade industry in the coastal United States and Hawaii. His mother was Hannah Kalikolehua-a-Mahi Holmes (c. 1797-1847), who was the granddaughter of Kalanihoʻoulumokuikekai (1729-1782) and Kalanikupaulakea (1760-1795) of the Mahi line of chiefs. His father was Captain William Heath Davis Sr. (1796-death unknown), a sandalwood trader and advisor to King Kamehameha I (c. 1758-1819).

In 1842, Davis became a prominent merchant and shipowner in San Francisco, California. While his businesses were growing, he visited San Diego many times, eventually making the city his home. In 1847, Davis married into the Estudillos family, prominent Old Town San Diegans.

In 1850, Davis became one of the founders of "New Town" in San Diego, which was the beginnings of what is now Downtown San Diego. He envisioned a town closer to the waterfront that would support a thriving trade industry in the city. With his business partners, Davis purchased 160 acres of land and laid out plans for the city, starting with a large wharf and warehouse. Their plans were halted, however, due to an economic depression in 1851. Plans for the city of San Diego would not proceed until almost 20 years later with the arrival of Alonzo Horton (1813-1909).

Davis died in Hayward, California in 1909. Today, he is being honored in multiple ways. The Davis-Horton House, previously known as the William Heath Davis House, is the oldest house in Downtown San Diego. It continues to be preserved today as a testament to Davis's contributions to the foundation of the city. In addition, the Gaslamp Quarter Historical Foundation and the Kanaka Davis Trust Group are unveiling the William Heath Davis Jr. Monument on Saturday, May 10th from 10:30am to 2:00pm in Pantoja Park.


