She is a staff writer for "The Daily Aztec" and a board member of SDSU's chapter of Asian American Journalists Association. She recommends Cafe 86, a Filipino American-owned dessert shop. Cafe 86 was established in 2014 by Ginger and James Dimapasok, both of whom wanted to bring the signature ube (purple yam) flavor of the Philippines to a wider audience. Cafe 86 started with a location in Chino, California and has branched out throughout California, Nevada, and Arizona. Jenna said, "I really love the flavor ube and Cafe 86 has such a wide variety of ube desserts, pastries and drinks! There is a location in Chula Vista and I believe another one is opening in Mira Mesa soon. Whenever I go, I always order one of the following: Ube Leche Flan Cupcake, Ube Crinkles or Ube Crack Cheesecake. For drinks, I recommend the Ube Iced Latte or Ube milk tea. Everything is super delicious!"

Fun Fact: Jenna wrote an article about ube entitled, "<u>Ube, the purple yam rooted in Filipino culture</u>" on her personal website. It covers how the flavors connects to Filipino culture, where it can be found locally in San Diego, and the differing opinions about the flavor being sold by larger companies.
