APIDA: 2024-25 NUMBERS

As we get ready to start a new academic year, we wanted to take a minute to reflect on our achievements from the previous year. We are so proud of our impact numbers. Check out our 2024-2025 Snapshot. Since 2020, the APIDA Center has hosted over 1544 events with over 38,653 attendees and over 38,013 visits to the Center; we have also supported over 2517 advising appointments.



APIDA Center learns about birthright citizenship!

In August 1895, Wong Kim Ark (1873-1935) returned to San Francisco from a trip to China but was denied reentry under the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882. Although he was born in the United States, customs officials did not recognize his citizenship. Wong challenged this in court, and the case eventually reached the Supreme Court. In *United States v. Wong Kim Ark* (1898), the Court ruled in Wong's favor, establishing birthright citizenship.

Birthright citizenship is the automatic granting of citizenship to children at their birth. The United States uses two methods to determine birthright citizenship: *jus soli* and *jus sanguinis*. Jus soli, based on the Fourteenth Amendment, grants automatic citizenship to anyone born on U.S. soil, regardless of their parents' citizenship. Jus sanguinis is governed by the Immigration and Nationality Act and the Child Citizenship Act of 2000. It allows children born abroad to a U.S. citizen parent to acquire citizenship.

Recent efforts by some federal officials to reinterpret birthright citizenship would revoke automatic citizenship for U.S.-born children of undocumented immigrants or temporary visa holders. These changes would disproportionately affect the Asian American community, especially those with mixed-status or recently immigrated members living in places like San Diego.

Asian Americans are the only racial group in the United States where a majority (65%) are foreign-born. In 2023, 22.4% of San Diego's population was foreign-born. Asian American residents make up 16.2% of the city's population and over half are first-generation immigrants. The City of San Diego joined a coalition of local governments nationwide to oppose challenges to birthright citizenship.

The APIDA Center affirms the rights and dignity of all individuals, regardless of immigration status. The <u>SDSU Monarch Unity Resource</u> <u>Center (MURC)</u> supports students and families of mixed status. Through its partnership with Jewish Family Services (JFS) and the Higher Education Legal Services (HELS) initiative, current SDSU students, staff, and faculty can access free, personalized immigration legal services from qualified attorneys and DOJ-accredited representatives. These services are culturally responsive, trauma-informed, and available directly on campus. Dr. **AJ Kim**, associate professor of City Planning in the School of Public Affairs, was selected as one of eight External Faculty Fellows at the Stanford Humanities Center. Dr. Pham is a Professor and Associate Dean for Research in the College of Health and Human Sciences. She is also director of the Bilingual Development in Context Lab. Dr. Higurashi is professor emerita of Japanese and SDSU advisor for the Fulbright U.S. Student Program.
