One of the first new things you'll notice is our "door signs"! We'll also have some new swag items, new programs, and of course, new students.


Although this summer flew by and we all benefitted from a little rest and relaxation, we are very excited to have love and laughter back in the space. We can't wait to see you!






APIDA Center learns about the fight for ethnic studies!

Ethnic Studies was not always a part of the university landscape; its presence is the result of persistent student advocacy. And, the CSU was at the forefront. In 1968, students at San Francisco State formed the Third World Liberation Front (TWLF). TWLF was established by a multiethnic coalition of Black, Chicano, Asian American, and Native American students. On November 6, 1968, the longest student strike in U.S. history began, lasting five months. Inspired by this, students at UC Berkeley launched their own TWLF strike on January 22, 1969. The Afro-American Students Union, Mexican-American Student Confederation, Native American Student Union, and Asian American Political Alliance (AAPA), joined together. These students demanded to be seen and heard in the curriculum, in faculty representation, and in the student body. The strike faced police violence, teacher protests, and campus shutdowns. Its ultimate victory led to the establishment of ethnic studies across the nation.

Part of building this coalition meant developing new language for identity and solidarity. The term "Asian American" was first coined at UC Berkeley by Emma Gee (1941-2006) and Yuji Ichioka (1936-2002), founders of AAPA. "Asian American" is more than a label; it reflects a rich culture and history that eventually found recognition as an academic discipline. At SDSU, the <u>Asian American Studies (AAS)</u> program was launched in 2021 and the AAS Department was formally established in Spring 2025. Our communities fought long and hard for the privilege of enrolling in AAS classes. Take advantage of it! Enroll in an AAS class today!








APIDA Center meets and greets new students!
