



From Dr. Loh-Hagan: Remember September!

• Sept 30: Coconut Party



APIDA Center learns about George Douglas Freeth!

George Douglas Freeth Jr. (1883–1919) was born on O'ahu to a part-Native Hawaiian mother and an English father. From an early age, he was drawn to the ocean, excelling as a champion swimmer and skilled diver. Surfing came naturally to him. In 1907, Freeth left Hawaii and moved to Los Angeles, where he introduced surfing to wide audiences by performing for crowds at Venice Beach. He also promoted swimming, water polo, and diving.

At the time, drowning deaths were at an all-time high, which made Freeth's deep knowledge of the ocean especially invaluable. He dedicated himself to teaching water safety and training groups of young swimmers who later became the foundation of lifeguard services across SoCal counties, including Los Angeles, Long Beach, and San Diego. His methods emphasized quick thinking and decisive action; his advice to swim parallel to shore when caught in a rip current is still used today. His most famous act of heroism came in 1908, when he leapt repeatedly from Venice Pier during a storm to save seven Japanese fishermen.

In 1915, the San Diego Rowing Club recruited him to direct its expanding swim program. Under his guidance, the club's small team developed into one of the strongest in the state. For several summers on Coronado Island, he worked as an instructor and pool supervisor. At night, Freeth balanced his teaching with public exhibitions of diving and swimming. Freeth's role in San Diego became especially important in May 1918 when a heat wave brought thousands to Ocean Beach and rip currents claimed thirteen lives. Soon after, the city hired him to organize professional lifeguard services. He introduced equipment such as the tripod rescue reel and adapted a motorcycle with a sidecar for rapid response, raising the standard for ocean rescue in the region.

This September 2025, let's learn about Hawaiian histories and highlight individuals like Freeth, whose knowledge and skill carried Native Hawaiian traditions into new communities. Freeth's lifesaving work in San Diego stands as a testament to the enduring contributions of Native Hawaiians beyond the islands.
