
APIDA Center learns about Hawaiian Civic Clubs!

The Hawaiian Civic Club movement was established in 1918 by Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole (1871–1922), a prominent statesman who worked tirelessly to advance Native Hawaiian rights and representation. Kalaniana'ole introduced the first bill for Hawaiian statehood in 1919. He recognized that political progress required collective action. He envisioned civic clubs as spaces where Hawaiians, no matter where they resided, could organize, strengthen their social and economic standing, and cultivate leadership rooted in cultural values. What began with a single club soon grew into the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, a network dedicated to civic responsibility and cultural preservation.

In San Diego, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders (NHPI) make up 0.6% of the population as of 2024; their presence, however, has deep roots. Polynesian navigators were skilled sailors of the Pacific long before Captain James Cook (1728-1779) arrived in Hawaii in 1778. These navigators connected island chains and coastal lands, including California. Centuries later, migration to San Diego increased through military service. The city's major naval bases drew many NHPIs, who joined the armed forces and often chose to settle with their families after their service. Their presence has shaped the cultural landscape of the San Diego region, especially via the Hawaiian Civic Clubs in San Diego. These clubs are committed to cultural preservation, community service, and civic engagement.

One enduring example is the <u>Hui O' Hawai'i of San Diego</u>, founded in 1969 by families who relocated to the mainland after the Korean War (1950-1953). Like other clubs, its work extends beyond cultural celebration to include strengthening the civic and social welfare of its members. Practices such as lei hulu feather work, lū'aus, and storytelling ensure Hawaiian traditions continue across generations.
