


From Dr. Loh-Hagan: 2025 AANAPISI Week!

SDSU is a proud AANAPISI. This upcoming week (September 22-28, 2025) is celebrated as [AANAPISI Week](#). The Asian American Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institution (AANAPISI) designation was signed into law on September 27, 2007 as part of the College Cost Reduction and Access Act of 2007. This law created a federal grant program to support colleges and universities with a high enrollment of APIDA students. This was done by amending the Higher Education Act of 1965. The program was intended to expand access to education and increase campus capacity to close equity gaps.

AANAPISIs are part of federally recognized Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs). The AANAPISI designation is a result of years of advocacy by APIDA education coalitions, student activists, and more. Advocates highlighted the lack of resources for APIDA student populations and the negative impact of the "model minority" stereotype. APIDA students faced historical invisibility in higher education, with a lack of data and a monolithic view hindering the recognition of their diverse needs and challenges, especially those from low-income and immigrant backgrounds.

Now, more than ever, we need to remain steadfast in our support of MSIs. Our AANHPI programs are funded by the campus and the state; but we are collectively impacted as a community. It's important to remember that all students benefit from AANAPISI and MSI programs which improve, enhance, and increase campus resources and services. These programs foster a more inclusive and diverse campus climate which increase workforce readiness, global citizenry, diverse perspectives, and more.

SDSU is a proud AANAPISI and HSI. We will be hosting a presentation and discussion on what it means to be an AANAPISI on Tuesday, September 23rd from 4-5pm at the APIDA Center. Can't make it? Don't worry! We will be repeating this program virtually throughout the year.


APIDA Center plays Word Games!

The following was curated by the [Charles Wei-Hsun Fu Center for Asian and Pacific Studies](#) (CAPS):

Lola Fregoso was selected as the CAPS Asian Studies outstanding graduating senior in 2024. Fregoso named Dr. **Zheng-sheng Zhang** as their most influential faculty.

Dr. **Zheng-sheng Zhang** started his new position as an assistant editor on the editorial board of the quarterly journal *Fulbright Chronicles*. Zhang also a talk at Duke University in Kunshan China about his 2024 book "Chinese Signs: An Introduction to China's Linguistic Landscape" published by Cambridge University Press.

Dr. **Stephen Suh** was awarded the 2025 Academy of Korean Studies (AKS) Fellowship in Korean Studies at Goethe University in Frankfurt, Germany. As a fellow, Suh helped to organize an international conference at Goethe University, titled "Diversity in/and Korea." He also taught a summer seminar course at Goethe University, titled "Diversity in Korea."

Dr. **Sandra Wawrytko** held a lecture titled "Experiential Wisdom of 'Just This': Bashō's Haiku (Poems) Composition Viewed Through Neuroscience." Located at the Hsi Fang Temple, this lecture was part of the temple's "Thank Buddha It's Friday" program. She spoke about her findings regarding how the Zen Poet Bashō utilized haiku composition as a form of experiential wisdom to access "just this" — a direct, non-discriminating awareness of reality, free from the distortions of self.

Dr. **Chyun Oh** hosted and taught K-pop dance classes for exchange students abroad. Oh also published an article entitled, "[Authenticities of K-pop Cover Dance Influencers in/from Bali, Indonesia](#)" in *Dance Chronicle*.

Dr. **Grace Cheng** gave two lectures on "International instruments on Indigenous Peoples" and "Extractivism and Environmental Rights" at a summer course on Access to Justice in Southeast Asia and Beyond at the University of Jember, East Java, Indonesia. Four SDSU students also participated in the course and were also able to attend the 8th International Human Rights Conference at the University of Airlangga in Surabaya, Indonesia where Cheng also gave a plenary address on "Human Rights Challenges in the Political Economy of Extractivism."

Dr. **Jaeyoung Kim** carried out archival research in South Korea and presented his papers at a multitude of conferences including: the 2025 Korean Association of International Studies (KAIS) in Yeosu, the 2025 International Political Science Association (IPSA) World Congress in Seoul, the Kangwon National University (KNU) International Conference, and more. Kim also published a chapter entitled, "Conclusion: Rethinking Great Powers, Regions, and Peaceful Change in the New Cold War Era" in ["The New Cold War and the Remaking of Regions."](#)

Dr. **Mei Zhong** was named by the SUNY Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) Center as the COIL Ambassador of SDSU. COIL is a teaching methodology that allows college faculty and students to connect virtually with their international counterparts around the world.

Dr. **Minjeong Kim** has published several articles: (1) "[Cross-Border Anxiety among Korean Border Commuters at the US-Mexico Border](#)" in the *Journal of Borderlands Studies*, (2) "[The Emerging Second Generation in Asia](#)" in *Ethnic and Racial Studies*, and (3) "[The Second Generation's Perceptions of South Korea's Public Support Programs for Multicultural Families](#)" in *Ethnic and Racial Studies*.
