From Dr. Loh-Hagan: Moon Festival & Banned Books!

October 6th this year was a busy day for us - It was Moon Festival and the start of Banned Books Week, which celebrates the freedom to read by raising awareness of censorship and challenges to books in libraries schools. The SDSU Library hosted its annual "Readout for Banned Books" - an event where students, faculty, and staff read excerpts from challenged or banned books to highlight the importance of the right to read. (Many thanks to **Rebecca Williamson** and Dean **Scott Walter** for hosting.)

So, of course, I just had to read aloud Grace Lin's *A Big Mooncake for Little Star*, which is about mooncakes, Moon Festival, and the moon. Surprisingly, it was temporarily removed from circulation in a city in Pennsylvania due to its inclusion on a list of diverse books with some criticizing its focus on Chinese culture and characters. The decision was reversed after news of the ban gained national attention, leading to public backlash and protests.

The SDSU APIDA Center proudly celebrated the Moon Festival with activities and a gathering hosted by our very own CFO and VP, **Agnes Wong Nickerson**. I feel over the moon to have a community of strong Chinese/Chinese American/APIDA leaders and allies at SDSU. May the force (of the moon) be with all of us!

APIDA x LGBTQ+ History Month

APIDA Center learns about LGBTQ+ History Month!

October is also LGBTQ+ History Month. It is distinct from Pride Month, which commemorates the 1969 Stonewall protests against police raids at the Stonewall Inn in New York. LGBTQ+ History Month focuses on education and visibility. Established in 1994 by Missouri teacher Rodney Wilson (born 1965) - the first openly gay public school teacher in the state - the month was created to focus on history. October was specifically selected. First, it coincides with National Coming Out Day on October 11th. Second, it also commemorates the first and second marches on Washington for LGBTQ+ rights in 1979 and 1987. Third, school is still in session in October (versus Pride month which is in June). Equality Forum helps to coordinate LGBTQ+ History Month and aims to highlight 31 LGBTQ+ icons or pioneers - one for each day of the month in October.

In thinking about APIDA LGBTQ+ pioneers from San Diego, we would like to amplify Christopher Lee (1964–2012). Born in San Diego, Lee was a pioneering filmmaker and activist who built community within Bay Area Asian Pacific Islander queer spaces. His award-winning films centered around BIPOC trans men and helped shape the beginnings of transgender topics in film. In 1997, he co-founded the San Francisco Transgender Film Festival, the first of its kind in North America. Lee made history as the first openly transgender man elected as Grand Marshal for the 2002 San Francisco Pride. Following his passing in 2012, community members rallied to address the misgendering on his death certificate. Their advocacy led to the creation of California's Respect After Death Act in 2014; this act ensures that coroners and funeral directors accurately record a person's gender identity on death certificates. San Diego-based organization Equality California supported the law's passage, continuing the legacy of dignity and visibility that Lee championed throughout his life.

We were thrilled to welcome students and their families on Friday, October 3rd for Family Weekend. Folks toured the space and learned more about our resources and services.



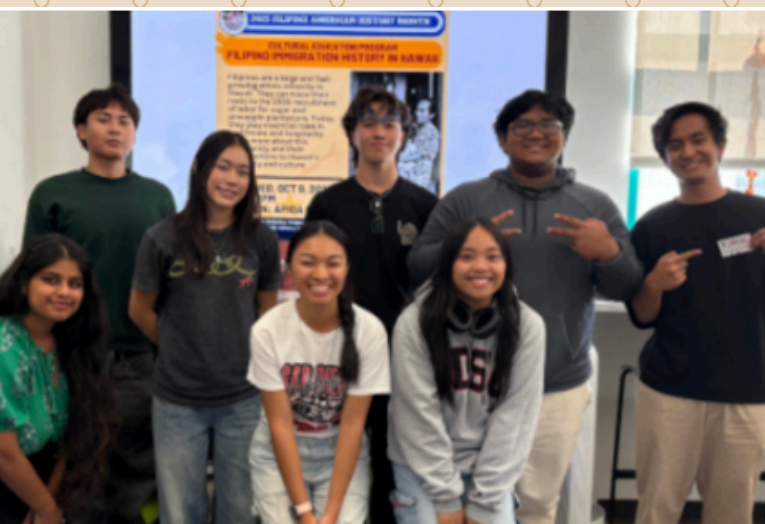
APIDA Center co-hosts a Suite 210 social!
