APIDA Center learns about Virgil Sales Yalong Jr.!

As we move into the last week of Filipino American History Month (FAHM), we would like to spotlight **Virgil Sales Yalong, Jr.** (1980–2016), a SDSU alumnus, whose work made a lasting impact on San Diego's arts and nonprofit scene. Yalong Jr. earned his B.A. in art and graphic design in 2005. After graduating, he contributed to organizations such as Rising Arts Leaders of San Diego as the Advocacy Chair, Asian Story Theatre as a playwright, and A Reason to Survive (ARTS) as a teaching artist. He was also a playwright with the Old Globe Community Voices and Malcolm X Library Playwright workshop. Through these roles, he mentored young creatives and worked to expand access to the arts to the San Diego Fil-Am community.

He also served as the assistant festival director of the Filipino American Festival (FilAmFest) in San Diego and was often referred to as the "heart of FilAmFest." Established in the early 2000s in the Paradise Hills neighborhood, this festival was founded to celebrate Fil-Am heritage through art, culture, and education. His leadership helped FilAmFest grow into a cornerstone community event that celebrates local talent and helps students get scholarships. He had said, "As a member of the [FilAmFest](#), I do a lot of outreach to high schools and the information about scholarships was a helpful addition for me to continue encouraging students to pursue their educational goals."

Even after his passing in 2016, Yalong's influence continues. The [Council of Philippine American Organizations of San Diego \(COPAO\)](#) established the [Virgil Yalong – Larry Itliong FAHM Essay Contest](#) in 2024, which is a highlight of the Larry Itliong Community Breakfast. (Fun Facts: Last year, the APIDA Center sponsored a table at the inaugural Larry Itliong Community Breakfast and met Cynthia Bonta, a legacy labor rights activist. We also visited the COPAO office during our FAHM field trip.)

APIDA Center learns about Shisha!

On October 20th, we hosted our first Diwali event and learned about Shisha embroidery, an ornamental technique that attaches small mirrors onto fabric with decorative stitches. This Indian mirror-work embroidery is often used in Diwali celebrations to catch and reflect light, which is a central theme of Diwali. The event was developed and hosted by **Alisha Sukhu**, our APIDA Student Intern. (Alicia supported most of our Diwali programming this year.)



APIDA Center participates in AAS KidLit panel!

On October 21st, Dr. **Alvin J. Henry**, Director of the Asian American Studies department, hosted a panel about Asian American children's literature. He invited Dr. **Loh-Hagan** and Dr. Radhika Natarajan to be guest speakers. We talked about representation, authenticity, capitalism, and more. Dr. Henry said, "...children's literature is now also increasingly a site of intervention and resistance - writers like Drs. Natarajan and Loh-Hagan are creating new archives, new aesthetics, new ways of seeing, and sparking the imaginations of children across the globe....Today, we're going to think about children's literature as aesthetic practice, historical methodology, and political work."



APIDA Center plays poker for Diwali!

To honor the Goddess Lakshmi, the Hindu goddess of wealth, many Hindus play poker and other card games during Diwali. This is believed to bring blessings of wealth and prosperity. So, naturally, on October 21st, we played poker!



APIDA Center observes APIDA LGBTQ+ History Month!

On October 22nd, we learned about LGBTQ+ history month and about 31 APIDA LGBTQ+ pioneers. (Part of the celebrations is to honor 31 icons each year.) We also hosted a watch party featuring "Saving Face," a 2004 rom-com-dram. It was the first Hollywood movie that centered on Chinese Americans since "The Joy Luck Club" in 1993. It was also pioneering in its depiction of a lesbian romance. A landmark Asian American film, it provided much-needed representation tackling multigenerational conflict and the struggle for personal happiness against cultural pressures.



APIDA Center makes rangoli coasters!

On October 23rd, we hosted our last Diwali event and learned about rangoli and then made rangoli coasters. Rangoli is a traditional art form of creating decorative, colorful patterns on the floor or tabletop using materials like colored powders, rice flour, sand, flower petals, etc. It is a significant part of Diwali and is believed to bring good luck, prosperity, and happiness while warding off evil spirits.
