

From the sudden loss of Ernie Flores, Jr., Publisher, Founder, and Editor-In-Chief of The Filipino Press, Journalist, to the thought of not seeing Mr. Flores with his cameras, notepad, tape recorder and child-like smile out and about in the Filipino community, it breaks the hearts of thousands in National City and San Diego.

Consider the "dean" of Filipino-American journalists in San Diego & County. Mr. Flores was a pioneer of his time, a journalist, photographer and newsman in the Filipino community as well as a father, grandfather, dancer, son, and friend to many. But above all, Mr. Flores's life is a testament of the knowledge, love, and

APIDA Center learns about "The Filipino Press"!

For the past several years, we have visited "The Filipino Press" as part of our FAHM field trip. "The Filipino Press" is a bi-monthly publication that serves the Filipino community in San Diego and all over southern California. Ernie Flores, Jr. (1930-2005) was its founder, publisher, and former Editor-In-Chief. Known as the "Dean of Filipino Journalists," Flores was inspired by his father who was a journalist in the 1930's in the Philippines. In 1967, he immigrated to the United States and became the first Filipino journalist for a Phoenix-based newspaper called, "The Arizona Republic."

In 1969, he moved to San Diego and worked for local newspapers and publications, such as "The San Diego Tribune," where he was recognized for being its first Filipino journalist. Noticing an increase in the number of Filipino residents around the South Bay area, he decided to start his own publication in 1986, thus "The Filipino Press" was born. (He had collaborated and co-founded other Asian-American and/or Filipino-centered publications, such as "The U.S. Manila Post," "The Asian American Times," "The Asian-Pacific News," "Asia World," and "The El Papel San Diego Times."

He aimed to highlight the voices of the San Diego Filipino community. The motto of "The Filipino Press" is "Your Key to the Filipino Community." After passing away in 2005, ownership passed on to Susan Delan Santos. The Flores family legacy and love for journalism continues as Flores' son, Brian, is a reporter and televised anchor at Channel Q13 Fox News in Seattle. News and narratives continue to be important to our communities. Keep telling and listening to stories.
