

APIDA Center learns about Valerio's Bakeshop!

Pan de sal is a beloved soft and mildly sweet Filipino bread roll. Although it is enjoyed year-round, it holds a special place during the holiday season, featuring in festive meals and special holiday variations. Filipino bakeries often highlight pan de sal during the "12 days of Christmas" countdown.

In San Diego, multiple Filipino bakeries produce pan de sal daily, one being Valerio's. Valerio's Bakeshop in National City was the first to open in the United States. It is a family-owned bakery known for serving fresh hot pan de sal and various Filipino desserts. The baker originated in the 1950s, when Victor Valerio Sr. (1920–1988) opened Cavite City Bakery in the Philippines, where the family prepared pan de sal each morning. His son, Jaime "Jimmy" Valerio (1948–2014), later served in the U.S. Navy and relocated to San Diego in the 1970s, which enabled the family to establish a bakery abroad. On May 19, 1979, the first U.S. Valerio's (formerly "Valerio's City Bakery") opened on E. 8th Street in National City.

Today, the bakeshop has expanded across California, the United States, and abroad - with locations in cities such as Carson, Jacksonville, Houston, Honolulu, Seattle, and Toronto. Six of Valerio's children are involved with the success of their family business, and now the fourth generation of the Valerio family continues the legacy.

In 2025, the National City location received national recognition for its pan de sal, winning the Showstopper Savory award at the World Bread Awards USA. As the largest bread-focused competition in the Western Hemisphere, the event draws entries from a wide range of professional and independent bakeries. Valerio's victory marked an important moment for Filipino representation in international baking.

Fun Fact: On Thursday, December 11th, the APIDA Center hosted a student-led workshop on the "History of Pan De Sal," presented by **Jalen Rodriguez** (APIDA Student Intern). Jalen's father owns Valerio's Tropical Bakeshop in Vallejo, California! He said, "'Filipino American history is kneaded into each roll of Valerio's pan de sal. It is a reminder that the most mundane things can carry profound meaning.'
